

Laytex Paints

Laytex paints can be placed with regular trash only if the paint has been dried. Paint can be dried by allowing it to sit out and thus dried by the elements. Paint can also be dried up by placing cat litter in the paint can and allowing it to absorb the paint. There are also entities that will take your paint for an extra fee. You may contact the Borough for additional information.





Batteries

Alkaline batteries may be disposed of in your regular garbage. The Borough's current hauler will accept car batteries at no additional cost.



TYRONE BOROUGH RECYCLING PROGRAM





In July, 2018, Tyrone Borough discontinued our membership within the Intermunicipal Relations Committee (IRC), saving tax payer money. The Borough has developed our own recycling program. This brochure will explain the program and outline the do's and don'ts for recycling.

Recyclables from residential dwellings may be placed at the curbside (or designated location) on the same day as your regular garbage collection. Please refer to your recycling calendar provided by the Borough's contracted hauler.

Recycling bins are available to Borough residents at no cost. Proof of residency is required.

The IRC will no longer accept items from Tyrone Borough residents, however Snyder Township and surrounding residents may still utilize the IRC facilities.

The Borough's current hauler, Burgmeier Hauling, will accept old car batteries and used motor oil as long as in separate containers, at no charge. Tires, refrigerators and freezers can be picked up for an additional fee.

ITEMS TO BE RECYCLED

- Cardboard boxes (must be broken down)
- Food boxes (i.e. cereal boxes, jello boxes)
- Paper towel & toilet paper rolls
- Paperboard packaging (i.e. tissue & shoe boxes)
- Office paper (any color)
- Newspaper & inserts
- Magazines & Catalogs
- Junk mail & envelopes
- Paper bags
- Aluminum beverage cans
- Steel food & beverage cans
- Aerosol cans
- Plastic bottles
- Clear, green & brown glass food & beverage containers













ITEMS TO BE PUT WITH YOUR REGULAR GARBAGE

- Plastic Bags
- Food soiled cardboard
- Wax-coated cardboard (i.e. milk cartons)
- Aluminum Foil
- Scrap Metal
- Plastic tubs, cups and trays
- Deli/take-out containers
- Broken glass
- Windows, mirrors, ceramics and light bulbs
- Drinking glasses

HOW TO PREPARE ITEMS FOR RECYCLING:

- Remove all packaging (Styrofoam, peanuts, bubble wrap, et)
- Flatten ALL boxes
- Remove non-paper objects from paper items
- Remove and discard caps/lids in trash
- Rinse thoroughly
- Labels and neck rings may be left on containers
